Dear colleagues,

We invite you to publish your articles in the scientific and methodological journal *“Problems of Modern Russian Studies”*.

This journal is organized by the Branch of Lomonosov Moscow State University in Yerevan. Its editorial board includes prominent Russian and international scholars. The journal’s wide-ranging sections offer opportunities for Russian and Slavic specialists working in various fields of linguistics and methodology to publish their work.

In addition, the journal plans to publish articles by scholars from related fields who are not specifically focused on Slavic studies (e.g., Anglicists, Germanists, etc.).

We also welcome articles from undergraduate and postgraduate students in the section titled *First Steps in Science*.

The working languages of the journal are **Russian, Armenian, and English**.

The Editorial Board has established specific submission guidelines for authors. All submitted materials are subject to peer review and a strict selection process.

Sections of the journal include:

- Issues of Intercultural / Cross-cultural Communication
- Linguistic Issues: A Note to Methodologists
- Russian Studies News (books, textbooks, journals, conferences)
- Guest Page (foreign languages in Armenia/CIS; humanities: psychology, literary studies, history, philosophy, etc.)
- First Steps in Science
- Information Block

Objectives of the journal "Problems of Modern Russian Studies":

- To popularize Russian Studies as a branch of linguistics in the Republic of Armenia
- To increase interest in learning the Russian language
- To attract international researchers to the work of Armenian scholars and thereby promote Armenian Russian Studies
- To create opportunities for joint projects, grants, and collaboration
- To involve undergraduates in scientific research

Upon receipt, the Editorial Board will review your materials within **3 working days** and send a confirmation email.

If you do not receive confirmation, please resend your materials or contact the Editorial Board.

REQUIREMENTS FOR MATERIALS

Uniqueness

- The originality of the text must be at least **75%**.

Responsibility

- The submitted materials will be published **without changes**, and authors bear full **copyright responsibility** for their content.

Article Length

- From **3 to 10 pages** of typewritten text (A4 format).

File Format

- Microsoft Word (*.doc, *.docx).

Languages

- The article should begin with details in **Russian, Armenian, and English**:
 - Full name (in all three languages)
 - University, city, country (in all three languages)

Abstract

- An abstract (annotation) must be included **before the main text**, written in **Russian, Armenian, and English**.
- Maximum length: **400 characters (including spaces)** for each language.

Keywords

- After the abstract, provide **up to 7 keywords** in **Russian, Armenian, and English**.

Page Numbering

- **Do not include** page numbers in the document.

Margins

- For abstracts and keywords: **1.5 cm** on the left and right.
- For the main text: **2 cm** margins on **all sides** (top, bottom, left, right).

Fonts

- Armenian: **Sylfaen**
- Russian: **Times New Roman**
- Latin (English): **Times New Roman**

Font Size

- **12 pt**

Line Spacing

- **Single (1.0)**

Text Alignment

- Align text **justified (by width)**

Paragraph Indentation

- 1 cm

Paper Size

- A4 (210 × 297 mm)

Figures and Tables

- Images must be in **JPG, GIF, or BMP** format.
- **Do not use** images created in Microsoft Word.
- Insert images directly into the text. They must be **clear, black-and-white**, and of high quality.
- **Do not rotate** pages for tables or images.
- **Figure numbers and captions** should be placed **below** the figures.
- **Table numbers and titles** should be placed **above** the tables.

References

- The list of references should be placed at the end of the article under the title “**LITERATURE**”, sorted in **alphabetical order**.
- In the main text, references should be indicated in square brackets with the source number and page number, e.g., [3: 111].
